Learn How To

- Rate the condition of your roads using PASER
- Enter your PASER ratings into WISLR
- Use WISLR to print reports and maps
- Use the WISLR pavement analysis and budget tools

Why Attend This Workshop

Each local government must rate the condition of its roads and submit condition ratings to Wisconsin DOT every odd-numbered year (before December 15). While WISLR is the tool to submit your pavement ratings, it has more features to help you plan your pavement maintenance and rehabilitation.

Rate Your Roads

You must rate your roads accurately to make effective decisions on road maintenance and rehabilitation. Statewide, accurate ratings are needed to provide a true picture of local road condition and overall funding needs. In this workshop you will learn to accurately rate asphalt pavement condition using the PASER rating system.

Submit Your Ratings

You will learn what road information is in WISLR and how to download your road data, including rating forms and maps to help you rate your roads. You will also learn how to enter your ratings and modify data directly in WISLR.

Budget and Plan More Effectively

You will be able to develop road maintenance and improvement budgets and a five-year plan using WISLR analysis tools.

Communicate Your Recommendations

You will be able to print maps, charts and reports to help you decide what projects to schedule. This information will help you communicate your proposed budgets and plans to other officials and the public.

Who Should Attend

This workshop is for local elected officials, street maintenance supervisors, engineering staff and consultants who want to manage pavements more effectively using PASER and WISLR, including those who:

- Inspect and rate pavement conditions
- Submit and update road data in WISLR
- Evaluate and recommend roads to maintain and rebuild
- Implement maintenance policies and programs

Computers are not required, but you may bring your laptop to follow along with the workshop using your WISLR data
