Budget Building Basics

Budget Building Basics sets the foundation for how to create a municipal budget in Wisconsin. In this session, you will learn what requirements must be lawfully included, how to create a budget summary for publication, and tips on where to find the numbers that ultimately make it into the budget.

Budget and Levy Adoption Procedures
