

### 2022 Wisconsin Towns Association Convention Highlights

#### Name Tags

Whether you are a registered town officer, spouse, or guest, your name tag is a very important item for your participation in the 2022 Wisconsin Towns Association Convention. It is your admission to convention functions. Please wear your name tag, as it identifies you as a registered attendee at the convention.

#### **Phone Courtesy**

We are all very busy and must occasionally take a phone call. Out of courtesy for other attendees, please put your cell phone on vibrate or silent during any program you attend. And, if you must take a call, please politely exit the room and have the conversation in the hallway.

#### **Workshops & General Assemblies**

A map of the Hotel and Exhibition Center is included in this material. General Assemblies will be held on Sunday afternoon at 2:30 pm, Monday morning at 8:30 am., and Tuesday at 11:00 am. They will be held in **Exhibit Hall A** of the **Fox Cities Exhibition Center.** Workshops will be held in the named breakout rooms in the **Hilton Appleton Paper Valley Hotel** listed in the following schedule. Most workshops are repeated except as identified in the schedule. Please take some time to acquaint yourself with the floor plan. Signs identifying the workshop name and room will be posted outside each room.

#### Exhibitor Area

The Exhibitors will have displays in **Exhibit Halls B and C** of the **Fox Cities Exhibition Center.** The displays will be open on Sunday afternoon from 1:00 pm to 6:00 pm and Monday from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm. We encourage all attendees to stop by the many commercial vendors and state government tables for information. On Sunday and Monday afternoon **Exhibitor Receptions** will be held in the Exhibitor Area. Coffee will be available from 8:00 am until 9:30 am on Monday morning in the Exhibitor Area and on Tuesday morning in the workshop area of the hotel, sponsored by **Scott Construction.** 

#### Sunday Afternoon and Evening

Convention attendees will have the opportunity to enjoy complimentary beer, soda, and snacks sponsored by **Rural Mutual Insurance** from 4:30 p.m. to 6:00 pm. while they visit with the exhibitors. Lunch is provided on Monday and Tuesday to registered officers as part of their registration. Lunch is not included in the spouse or guest registration. **Spouses and guests may purchase lunch tickets at a cost of \$17 per day at the registration desk.** Lunch tickets for officers and spouses/guests who purchased tickets in advance will be found in the envelope you received at the time of registration at the convention. **Tickets will be collected each day.** Lunch will be served in the **general assembly area**. Monday's lunch menu will feature a pasta buffet with tossed salad and breadsticks. Tuesday's lunch menu will feature soup and a make your own sandwich buffet.

#### Monday Evening Banquet & Awards Program (Optional Event)

The Monday evening Banquet and Awards Program will include recognition of town and village officers who have served 30 years or more and have achieved a 5-year increment as was indicated on their convention registration. This is an optional banquet at a cost of \$25 per ticket and is not included in the registration fees for officers or spouses/guests.

For those attendees who did not register for the banquet in advance, a limited number of tickets are available until Monday at 1:00 pm at the registration area.

The banquet will feature a buffet of oven roasted chicken, beef tips and buttered noodles, tossed salad, mashed potatoes with gravy, dinner rolls, chef's choice vegetable, and assorted brownies and bars.
